

Looking to the future through the **EYES** of our future.

The Tawas City Empowering Youth with Engagement Strategies (EYES) program was developed to engage our youth and receive their perspectives and opinions regarding the very important decisions the City makes about the future of Tawas City.

Tawas City EYES participants will hold a nonvoting seat on the Tawas City Planning Commission/Parks Board. This board consists of seven (7) additional members: one (1) representative from the City Council, and six (6) residents and/or community members who are appointed by the City Council.

What does the Planning Commission/Park Board do?

Michigan laws charge the Planning Commission with a large job. Among a long list of responsibilities, members make recommendations for the boundaries of the various zoning districts and the appropriate regulations to be enforced. Members also review zoning applications for new commercial uses and any special land uses.

One of the most important jobs of the Planning Commission is the preparation of the City's Master Plan. This document outlines the community's vision for the future and is the basis for or influence in the community's future, environmental protection, economic development, zoning, and other regulatory ordinances.

The Tawas City Planning Commission also acts as the Parks and Recreation Board, which is one of the most exciting parts of their responsibilities. Members are involved in making decisions regarding the development of the various parks and recreational activities in the City, and they are responsible for preparing the Parks and Recreation Plan.

Tawas City EYES participants will:

- Provide a younger perspective for discussions regarding community and civic issues
- Provide a voice for young people who may be affected by the City's decisions
- Bring a deeper understanding of the youth-related decisions the City may be considering
- Explain the City's goals and vision to other youth in the community
- Learn how local government and boards work, and learn meeting etiquette, facilitation, listening, diplomacy, and other skills necessary to be engaged and active in the community
- Learn to embrace a supported leadership role in the community

How often are the meetings and where are they held?

The Tawas City Planning Commission/Park Board usually meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm. Some meetings may be moved to the second Tuesday of the month, but are done with ample notice.

Meetings are held in the Council Chamber of Tawas City Hall located at 550 West Lake Street in Tawas City.

Participants are responsible for their own transportation to and from the meetings.

What is the time commitment?

Participants are expected to attend meetings that are held during the school year (October to May) but may attend additional meetings through the summer months if so desired. Although there are some exceptions, most meetings are less than an hour long.

Upon appointment to the program, participants will be assigned an advisor. This person will act as a liaison between the school and the City of Tawas City. Participants will be expected to keep

- Participate in monthly meetings which will involve group decision making and some public speaking
- Review new business and development plans as they are presented to the City
- Assist in developing project ideas
- Help set the vision for the future of Tawas City

the advisor updated on all absences and meeting conflicts, such as sports or academic commitments. Participants are expected to attend nine (9) meetings, but there may be opportunities to make up missed meetings in coordination with the City Manager and the advisor.

The advisor may ask participants to prepare a presentation for a classroom assignment to share their experiences in the Tawas City EYES program with their peers.

Who can apply?

The Tawas City EYES program is open to students who are entering their junior or senior year of high school, and who attend Tawas Area High School, the Alternative Education Academy, or are homeschooled, and who are interested in being involved in the community. Although not a requirement, preference may be given to individuals who are residents of the City of Tawas City.

What are the benefits for Tawas City EYES participants?

- Access to leadership in both local government and business
- High quality, organized, and focused leadership development experience
- Learn about local government and community-based organizations with an emphasis in collaboration
- Learn how to lead and follow for community enhancement
- \$500 scholarship toward continued education
- Opportunity for references from community leaders and business owners

What is the application process?

Complete and sign the application form and submit it with the required attachments which include a written response to questions and two (2) recommendation forms. All information must be submitted by 5:00 pm on Tuesday, October 22, 2019.
